

How To Allow Pop-Ups In Your Browser

Firefox 3.x (Windows)

1. Open the browser.
2. From the Tools menu, click Options.
3. Click the Content icon located across the top of the window.
4. Click the Exceptions button located to the right of Block pop-up windows.
5. You will see the Allowed Sites dialog box.
6. To enable the browser to recognize the course servers as trusted sites and, therefore, enable pop-ups from these sites, in the Address of web site field, type the two URLs below:
 www.balviharonline.com
 www.amicusclassrooms.com
7. Click Allow.
8. Click Close when you finish adding the above sites.
9. Click OK to close the Options dialog box.

Internet Explorer (Windows)

1. Open the browser.
2. From the Tools menu, click Pop-up Blocker.
3. Click Pop-up Blocker Settings.
4. In the Address of website to allow field, type
 www.balviharonline.com
5. Click Add.
6. In the Address of website to allow field, type
 www.amicusclassrooms.com
7. Click Add.
8. Click Close.

Firefox 3.x (Mac OS)

1. Open the browser.
 2. From the Firefox menu, click Preferences.
 3. Click the Content icon located across the top of the window.
 4. Click the Exceptions button located to the right of Block pop-up windows.
 5. You will see the Allowed Sites - Pop-ups dialog box.
 6. To enable the browser to recognize the course servers as trusted sites and, therefore, enable pop-ups from these sites, in the Address of web site field, type the two URLs below:
 - i. www.balviharonline.com
 - ii. www.amicusclassrooms.com
 7. Click Allow.
 8. Close the "Allowed Sites - Pop-ups" window when you finish adding the above sites.
 9. Close the Content dialog box.

Safari 4.0.x (Mac OS)

Safari for Mac OS has no per-website control over blocking pop-ups windows. Pop-ups are either blocked, or they are not. To allow pop-ups:

From the Safari menu, ensure the Block Pop-Up Windows option is not checked. Unchecking this option will allow pop-ups.

To block pop-ups once again, check Block Pop-Up Windows in the Safari menu. You can use a keyboard shortcut: [command key]-K.
